Senior Nationals

May 18th -19th 2002, Sept-Iles, Quebec

This year's Senior Nationals featured some best-ever performances from our athletes, and hopefully served as an eye-opener for others. The stars of the weekend were our -81 kg men, Bryan Nykon (silver), Aaron Davis (5th), Fred Jaskiewicz (5th), as well as a strong performance by Junior contender Kimi Suda (also 5th). Another athlete who deserves honorable mention is Burnaby's Jason Davis who was demolishing everyone in his path until a knee injury forced him out of the tournament.

Bryan's silver medal was BC's only medal of the tournament. This result by itself is exceptional. However, considering that he recovered from a serious knee injury at the Pacific International Senior Tournament in February, to compete at these championships it is even more impressive. Since the Nationals Bryan went on to compete at an international tournament in Mexico (representing Canada) where he also took the silver medal. He has returned to his training base in Montreal, where he has spent the past year training at the National Training Centre.

While some team member's accomplishments were exceptional, in general I do not feel that we as a province should be satisfied with a 1 medal performance, and I would like to take this opportunity to provide feedback as to why I feel we failed to achieve better results at this competition:

1. **Goal Setting & Planning:** In order to have any hope of succeeding at this level athletes need to have a goal, as well as having smaller progressive goals (or stepping stones) as to how they plan on reaching that goal. If the goal is to be Canadian Champion, or a medallist, then athletes need to actively seek out, and compete against/practice with the top competitors in their division **PRIOR** to the Canadian Championships. This strategy has two obvious benefits: 1. if you're weaker than them - it provides you with time and a benchmark for what you need to accomplish between then and the Nationals. 2. if you crush them - it is mentally empowering for you, and mentally devastating for your opponent.
2. **Preparation:** Plain and simple, most senior athletes did not train hard enough for this event. Yes, many of you came to judo regularly, but many of you are not training with enough intensity, practice with the same people constantly, avoid potentially challenging opponents, and never practice outside of what I call the "comfort zone". This was reflected at the tournament where many people did "randori" style judo. Many of you lost to people who had much less skill than you did, but were aggressively fighting to "win" and not just to throw you for ippon.
3. **Attitude:** As a coach, I realize that all athletes are different, however I feel that some things, especially attitude, are fundamental to all people who have succeeded in judo at higher levels. When the top judoka in Canada win, they continue to train extremely hard, but if they lose, **they train even harder**. This is a concept that I feel is totally missed by most of you, and it disappoints me as a coach to see so few of you training over the summer. You can bet that this is not the case everywhere in Canada. Judoka in other parts of the country are already working hard to improve on this year's performance – **harder than you**.

In conclusion, there are no short cuts to success, but the formula is quite simple and attainable by all: commitment, hard work and perseverance. It is never too late to change, but remember, next May is already fast approaching!

1. Judo BC Summer Camp, Blue Lake – August 25-31/02 **5 points**
2. Canada Winter Games training camp – September 28/02 **10 points**
3. Canada Winter Games selection tournament 1 – October 12/02
4. Canada Winter Games selection tournament 2 - held in conjunction with the BC Championships Shiai - November 2, 2002

Points for the two selection tournaments will be allocated as follows:

- First place – **15 points**
- Second place – **10 points**
- Third place – **5 points**

In most cases, the athlete with highest amount of points following all four selection activities will be selected, and will be required to attend all mandatory preparatory activities deemed necessary by the CWG coaching staff or will risk losing their status as a CWG team member.

Fight-offs will be held to determine selections in divisions where:

1. the winner of both selection tournaments **is not** the points leader. In this case, a fight-off will be held at a later date between the selection tournament winner and the points leader to determine the CWG representative
 2. following the completion of all selection activities 2 or more athletes are tied in points a fight-off will be held at a later date involving all tied athletes
 3. the Judo BC Technical Committee deems that a fight-off is necessary resulting from an individual case or case(s) where an athlete has been given special consideration resulting from special circumstances
- Fight-offs involving 2 athletes will be a best two out of three series. Fight-offs involving more than 2 athletes will be a round robin format.

Special Circumstances:

- Application for all special circumstances must be communicated to the Canada Winter Games coaching staff and followed up in writing prior to scheduled events.
- Injury exemptions will be considered on an individual basis by the CWG coaching staff in consultation with the Judo BC Technical Committee. A medical certificate must be provided.
- Injuries that occur during a CWG event that force withdrawal of the athlete must be followed up in a similar manner with a medical certificate.

1. No points from the 2002 Syllabus are to be inserted into the 1997 Syllabus eg:- Tournament & Clinic participation points and Coaching & Referee Certification points.
2. 2002 Syllabus point system starts on January 1, 2002. If additional points are required using the 2002 Syllabus then one must follow the criteria set forth in the 2002 Syllabus eg:- Ikkyu require 120 minimum to be considered for promotion, now with the 2002 Syllabus, of the 120 points 30 points must come from Technical points NG-3 and NG-3A.
