

## Changes to NCCP Program January 2010

### 1. Changes to course delivery:

Multisport A & Dojo Assistant courses will now be delivered as a single integrated course (called Dojo Assistant) Multisport B & Dojo Instructor courses will now be delivered as a single integrated course (called Dojo Instructor) Judo Canada is currently developing a sport specific Competition Development course (target Summer 2010) In the interim, for members seeking to pursue coaching development beyond the level of Dojo Instructor, Competition Development (formerly Level 3) is currently being delivered in separate modules outside of our association

\*Note individuals who have completed only the Multisport A and/Multisport B components under the old system will be given credit for completed modules and as a result will only need to attend a portion of the Dojo Assistant and/or Dojo Instructor course to complete certification requirements and will be charged for these courses on a pro rata basis.
