Big medal haul for BC athletes at Judo nationals

July 15, 2013 - Vancouver, BC: There was a record gold medal haul for BC's senior judokas as they made the most of competing at home in the 2013 Canadian Judo Championships.

Their five gold medals helped the province to a haul of 47 medals across all divisions at the Richmond Olympic Oval.

Brandon Jobb, of the Abbotsford Judo Club, led BC senior men's gold rush, topping the podium twice. He scored an Ippon, or immediate win, to take the 90kg senior men's title and he won the same weight title in the Under 21 division, also by Ippon.

Burnaby's Ignacio Rodriguez, who came second in the 2012 national championships in the over 100kg senior men's competition, went one better this year to take that title by Ippon.

Two more Burnaby judokas won gold in the senior division. Dmitri Kim defeated Quebec's Sergio Pessoa, a 2012 Olympian, to take the 60kg title, while Scott McGrandle topped the podium in the 81kg competition with a score of Waza-ari, or half point.

Steveston's Lisa Nakajima scored Ippon to become the senior women's 63kg champion.

BC athletes won eight gold medals in the junior categories. Megan Hanks, from Kamloops, Abby Lloyd, from Powell River, Sam Kim, from Steveston, and Jeff Swadden, from Abbotsford, all won their under 18 divisions and in the process qualified for the Under 18 World Championships in Miami in August.

Lloyd and Swadden also tasted success in the Under 21 division, winning bronze medals in the 48kg and over 90kg weight brackets respectively.

In the masters division, there were seven gold medals for BC athletes. Kelowna's Kathy Hubble became a six-time Canadian champion after winning the female 45-49 age category at the 57kg weight limit. Hubble previously won junior championships in 1983 and 1984, and three straight senior titles between 1985 and 1987.

Jeff DiMarco, of Williams Lake, successfully defended the gold he won in the Male 44-49 66kg category at the 2012 championships, but Port Coquitlam's Eric Cherneff, winner of the Male 44-49 over 100 kg title last year, had to settle for silver this year.

Sandy Kent, president of Judo BC, said: "I am extremely proud of our athletes and coaching staff for the results we achieved at the national championships. It shows that the hard work and TEAM BC 2013 Page 1



planning that has taken place over the years leading up to the event have paid off. Having it happen in BC at the iconic Olympic Oval was a fantastic opportunity to show what we have accomplished with Judo in this province."
